#### Funding Status – FY 2021 and FY 2020

#### FY 2021:

Wave 2 for FY 2021 was released on Thursday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>, for a total of \$62.9 million including \$298 thousand for seven North Carolina applicants. . Cumulative commitments are \$744 million including \$25.3 million for North Carolina. Nationwide, USAC has now funded 54% of the FY 2021 applications representing 25% of the requested funding.

#### *FY 2020:*

Wave 52 for FY 2020 was released on Wednesday, April 21<sup>st</sup>, for a total of \$2.70 million including none for North Carolina applicants. Cumulative commitments are \$2.32 billion including \$73.2 million for North Carolina. Nationwide, USAC has now funded 98% of the FY 2020 applications representing 86% of the requested funding.

#### **EBB/ECF Updates**

#### Emergency Broadband Benefit ("EBB"):

The EBB program, providing discounts on home internet services for low-income families is expected to become operational this week. Key informational resources on the program include the following:

Very little public information has been released for schools and libraries already providing residential internet service for their students and patrons seeking EBB discounts on their "bulk" subscriptions (as discussed in our <u>strategy memos</u>). In response to our inquiry, however, the FCC has confirmed that "the EBB discount available on to bulk billing arrangements if the provider is

approved to participate in the Program and the household is eligible to receive the benefit. Staff confirms that the broadband service must have been on offer as of December 1, 2020 and included in the provider's election notice submitted with USAC. Moreover, households must consent to participate in the program and the provider must retain that consent."

More information on the EBB program will be available in a <u>FCC webinar</u> to be held tomorrow, Tuesday, April 27<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 p.m. EDT.

<u>USAC's Schools and Libraries News Brief of April 23, 2021</u> provides more detail on the <u>E-Rate Invoices and Authorized Disbursements (FCC Forms 472 and 474) Dataset posted last week in the <u>Open Data</u> section of the USAC website (as had been promised in USAC's <u>previous</u> News Brief.)</u>

The new invoicing dataset includes information on all completed invoice line items for FY 2016 and later funding years. "Completed" line items are those that USAC has reviewed and issued a payment decision. Pending or canceled invoice items are not included.
