Funding Status

E-Rate for FY 2025 – Wave 1 Released:

Wave 1 of funding commitment decision letters for FY 2025 was released early Saturday morning, April 26th, for a total of \$981 million. This is slightly higher than the first wave for FY 2024 and represents just over half the applications filed (including out-of-window applications filed within two weeks of the March 26th window close). Nice job USAC!

Funding in the first wave included \$25.0 million for 228 North Carolina applicants.

E-Rate for FY 2024:

Wave 53 for FY 2024 was released on Thursday, April 24th, for \$12.6 million, none for North Carolina. Total funding is now \$2.67 billion including \$73.6 million for North Carolina. Currently, USAC has funded 98.4% of submitted applications, representing 92.6% of the dollars requested.

Cybersecurity Pilot Program – Application Window:

The Form 471 application window for the Cybersecurity Pilot Program opened on March 18th and will close on September 15th, 2025. Total pilot funding is capped at \$200 million for 707 applicants. Initial commitments include \$10.1 million for seventeen North Carolina applicants.

FTC Updates COPPA:

As laid out in detail in the <u>Federal Register</u> last week, the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") has adopted amendments to the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act ("COPPA"). The updates, largely clarifications of definitions, are intended to strengthen the protection of personal information collected online from young children and are in response to changes in technologies and online practices since COPPA was last amended in 2013. The revised COPPA rules become effective June 23, 2025.

COPPA has no direct effect on schools and libraries but can be considered as a companion set of regulations to the FCC's Children's Internet Protection Act ("CIPA") requirements under E-Rate. Most broadly, COPPA regulations are designed to protect the online privacy of children under 13 by requiring businesses to obtain verifiable parental consent before collecting, using, or disclosing their personal information. The rules require companies to post a privacy policy, provide direct notice to parents, and implement security measures to safeguard children's data.
